## Oil Painting Material List

1. **Painting Subject**: A photograph, or sketch, or some small personal objects, or ideas about subject matter you may wish to paint.

## 2. Board/Canvas:

Primed acrylic or oil painting paper in pads or loose sheets; or any size of stretched canvas, canvas boards or primed marine plywood or MDF.

- **3.** Colours Daler Rowney or Winsor Newton are good brands. Any student brand will do to start and preselected packages are good too. These are some of the colours I use:
  - Lemon yellow (cool)
  - Cadmium yellow light (warm)
  - Cadmium red(warm)
  - Alizarin crimson (cool)
  - Cobalt blue (cool)
  - French Ultramarine blue (warm)
  - Titanium white
  - Optional: the Earth colours yellow ochre, burnt sienna & burnt umber.
- **4. Brushes**: Long handle brushes: Bright #8 and #4, and round #6 and #4, all in synthetic bristle and/or hog bristle

5. Incidentals:

- Odourless solvent (Archival Oils or Gamsol, etc.),
- Liquin (Winsor Newton)
- Metal or glass jar & lid,
- Palette knife(s) with a wooden bent handle (not plastic and flat)
- old piece of cotton rag or paper towel roll for clean up
- Palette: For a palette the glass in an old picture frame will do
- Wet wipes (baby wipes)
- **6. Optional Extras**: A note book/sketch pad of 110gm paper (any size), a 2B graphite pencil, a pencil sharpener, and an eraser are suggested for 'thumbnail' sketches and note taking.
